

By adopting the O'ahu Good Food Program, we will use our purchasing power to encourage the production and consumption of locally grown food that is healthy, affordable, and sustainable. Our commitment will lead to more opportunities for small farmers to thrive, provide good jobs for our people, care for our place with sustainable farm practices, improve welfare for farm animals, and increase access to fresh and healthy food.

Through this Program, we pledge to use our purchasing power to support those goals and the following values:

Diverse Economy: Support small and mid-sized agricultural and food processing operations on O'ahu.

Environmental Sustainability: Support a healthy environment by sourcing from producers that employ sustainable production systems.

Good Jobs: Provide safe and healthy working conditions and fair compensation for food service workers and procure from producers who provide similar standards.

Ethical Treatment of Animals: Source from producers that provide healthy and humane conditions for farm animals.

Healthy Options: Increase consumption of high quality, culturally relevant and locally grown Good Food.

Care for Our Place: Preserve land for growing to sustain our people and place.

In our commitment to the Oʻahu Good Food Program, we agree to work closely with the City, and to take these steps:

- Communicate participation to all suppliers, including distributors and food service companies.
- Establish supply chain accountability and a traceability system with vendors/suppliers to verify sourcing commitments.
- Complete a baseline assessment of food procurement practices.
- Develop and adopt a multi-year action plan with benchmarks
- Comply with due diligence reporting requirements to assess baseline purchases and measure annual progress.

• Report annually on the implementation progress of the Good Food Purchasing Program.
